• Approval of Minutes from December 8, 2015 meeting

The Council took up minutes from the previous meeting. Minutes were approved.

• Public Comment

There was no public comment.

• Update from Texas Water Development Board

Director Peter Lake provided a brief update on the Texas Water Development Board.

• Discussion and possible action on best management practices development process

Jennifer Allis led the discussion on the language used on savetexaswater.org regarding development of best management practices (BMPs); specifically, whether "BMP approval" might be better than "BMP adoption" within the finalization stage. Mindy Conyers updated the council on improvements made to the website to improve clarity. Finalized best management practices were removed from workgroup development pages. Karen Guz led the discussion on drafting new best management practices and noted the progress made by the Municipal Workgroup on three forthcoming best management practices. No formal action was taken on this item.

• <u>Discussion and possible action on drafted letter to academia</u>

The council discussed the draft document written by Bill Hoffman, including how recipients could respond to the survey, who would sign the letter, and how responses would be documented. The council voted on a motion stating the letter will be sent from the Presiding Officer on behalf of the council with responses sent to council support staff at TWDB. Staff will edit the letter to include both an online survey and a traditional mail option for responding.

• <u>Discussion and possible action on preparation of 2016 Legislative Report</u>

The discussion first focused on the location of the recommendations to be included in this report per Senate Bill 551, passed during the regular session of the 84th Texas Legislature. One suggestion was to include a recommendation per each legislative charge plus a master list of all recommendations from the council. The council will revisit this topic at a later date. Other topics mentioned included featuring reductions in per capita water use and a recent study on demand hardening. Preliminary discussion of the seven legislative charges resulted in a suggestion that the chairs of the council's workgroup meet via conference call as soon as possible. Workgroup chairs will report back to the full council about those discussions at the next meeting. The council decided to maintain an aggressive timeline for the report. Other topics considered were whether or not to address drought restrictions, water use per bill as a metric, and implementation of Senate Bill 181 [82(R)] guidelines. No formal action was taken.

• Discussion and possible action on Blue Legacy Awards presentation site

The council did not take up this item.

• Presentation of "Insights on using data to drive conservation efforts in California. Are there lessons which can be applied in Texas?" by Jasper van Heesch of OmniEarth

• Reports from Workgroups

Agriculture - The workgroup hopes to receive feedback soon on updates to the brush control best management practice and would like to establish deadlines for the Blue Legacy Awards as soon as possible.

Commercial & Institutional - The Commercial and Institutional workgroup is incorporating suggestions in the best management practices guide and will not meet before the next council meeting.

Industrial - The workgroup will host a conference call as soon as it can be scheduled.

Municipal - The workgroup has updated best management practices that will be ready for stakeholder comment soon.

Public Awareness - The workgroup will host a conference call as soon as it can be scheduled.

Wholesale - The workgroup is working on best management practices for Water Conservation Education and Public Awareness, Providing financial incentives directly to customer's end-users, and Wholesale conservation water rates. A Technical Assistance and Outreach BMP should be posted for stakeholder comment soon.

• Announcements of conferences and events
