Approval of Minutes from the February 13, 2014 Meeting

The Council took up and approved minutes from the prior meeting.

Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Texas Water Development Board Update from Director Kathleen Jackson

Director Kathleen Jackson provided an overview of recent activities at the Texas Water Development Board, progress on the House Bill 4 rulemaking, and the desire for stakeholder input. Director Jackson also expressed her appreciation for the committed work of the Council.

Discussion on implementation of HB 3605 -establishing water loss metrics and thresholds

John Sutton presented on TWDB implementation of HB 3605 and water loss metrics. All retail public water suppliers report once every 5 years. Those with active financial obligations or with >3,300 connections report annually. The reports help track water loss, identify strategies and used as part of the TWDB financial application process.

Discussion on and Action on Content for the 2014 WCAC Legislative Report

CE Williams, chair, opened the floor to anyone who had any specific questions on portions of the reports.

Ken Kramer (via Jennifer Walker) offered to compile the reports from cities into an appendix and include a summary of the data received within the body of the report. The Council discussed the focusing on specific water conservation program examples and not including all programs across the state. Members stated that for the future they were interested in surveying for a full listing of programs after the report is released. Council members suggested adding the option on forms to name their programs (selfreporting) for the future. Currently, the Council would like to keep the report as generic and keep summaries in the appendix.

CJ Tredway discussed the Energy Water Nexus section. The Council is interested in keeping the section in the Legislative Report with edits from CJ and Bill Hoffman.

Ken Kramer (via Jennifer Walker) will work with Robert Mace on the reports from regional water planning groups to continue to fill the content for data from the surveys.

The Council discussed the SWIFT funding section content. The Agriculture workgroup turned in content on the subject but the Council would like to highlight all the portions of HB 4. Calvin Finch would look at writing content for the SWIFT subject on a section that solely focuses on SWIFT in relation to other portions of the bill besides Agriculture.

The Council inquired about the Education Grant program. TWDB is continuing to update that as more progress is made.
