• Approval of Minutes from March 7, 2016, meeting

The Council took up minutes from the previous meeting. Minutes were approved.

<u>Public Comment</u>

There was no public comment.

• Update from Texas Water Development Board

Board member Kathleen Jackson provided a brief update on activities of the Texas Water Development Board including the latest news on SWIFT funding and the 2017 Draft State Water Plan.

• Update and possible action on best management practices

The council voted unanimously to approve an updated best management practice on Technical Assistance and Outreach submitted by the Wholesale Water Providers workgroup. The vote sends the best management practice to TWDB for final review and approval before incorporating it into the online best management practices guide.

• Discussion of first draft of the report to the legislature

Mindy Conyers provided an overview of the status of the report to the legislature. The deadline for providing assigned content to TWDB for the second draft of the report is May 23.

John Sutton presented on target and goal guidelines in relation to Charge 7 ("Monitor target and goal guidelines for water conservation to be considered by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and Texas Water Development Board"). Presentation slides posted to www.savetexaswater.org/.

• Discussion and possible action on Blue Legacy Awards

The council discussed the nomination packets and related dates for the Blue Legacy Awards then voted to post the updated packets on the website immediately. A media blitz reminding potential applicants of the November deadline will occur in September.

• <u>Reports from Workgroups</u>

Agriculture - Jay Bragg reported that the workgroup received comments from TWDB on their revised agricultural best management practice and will host a conference call in early May to discuss them.

Commercial & Institutional - Bill Hoffman stated that progress has been made on analyzing data for the legislative report. Some discussion occurred on the role of total dissolved solids in commercial and institutional water conservation.

Industrial - Nothing to report.

Municipal - Karen Guz stated the workgroup will host a conference call soon to discuss the updated best management practice on System Water Audit and Water Loss. Some discussion occurred on how Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) addresses water conservation and whether the council should create a best management practice related to the PACE program.

Public Awareness - Denise Hickey stated the workgroup will host a conference call soon.

Wholesale - Nora Mullarkey stated that some preliminary work on a recommendation for the legislative report has been completed. Ms. Mullarkey also resigned as chair of this workgroup because she has retired from the Lower Colorado River Authority.
