• Approval of Minutes from September 30, 2015 meeting

The Council took up minutes from the previous meeting. Minutes were approved.

<u>Public Comment</u>

There was no public comment.

• <u>Update from Texas Water Development Board</u>

Robert Mace provided a brief update on the Texas Water Development Board including the February 5, 2016, deadline for abridged applications for SWIFT (State Water Implementation Fund for Texas) and the December 14, 2015, hearing on emergency flood funding.

<u>Water Conservation Advisory Council update by staff</u>

The vacancies on the council were filled at the October 28, 2015, meeting of the Texas Water Development Board. New and returning council members were encouraged to identify an alternate and to confirm their interest in specific council workgroups. The process for development and approval of best management practices was discussed. The council also discussed whether comments are solicited from 'the public' or from 'stakeholders' and determined that using the word 'stakeholders' was probably more appropriate. Timelines for a receiving stakeholder comments on draft best management practices and getting final versions to the council prior to a vote were also discussed, with thirty days set as the minimum comment period and three weeks out as the minimum timeframe for getting documents to the council.

• <u>Possible action on selection of a presiding officer and vice-presiding officer</u>

Council support staff provided an overview of the portion of the by-laws related to selecting a presiding officer and a vice-presiding officer for the council. After a call for nominations, Ken Kramer nominated C.E. Williams for presiding officer. The council voted to confirm the selection without opposition. Robert Mace was nominated to serve as vice-presiding officer, and the council voted to confirm without opposition.

• <u>Reports from Workgroups</u>

Agriculture - The workgroup had nothing to report.

Commercial & Institutional - The Commercial and Institutional workgroup has been working on their best management practices guide. Bill Hoffman requested case studies, examples, and details about how water is used, as well as information on benchmarks from meeting attendees.

Industrial - The workgroup had nothing to report but did request information on any case studies on industrial water conservation.

Municipal - The workgroup has updated and edited three best management practices that will soon be ready for stakeholder comment. The council discussed how much time a draft should be posted to allow for comment and decided that a document should be posted for a minimum of thirty days.

Public Awareness - The workgroup had nothing to report.

Wholesale - The workgroup plans to host a conference call meeting in the near future.

• Discussion and possible action on 2016 report to the legislature

The Council discussed a draft letter provided by Bill Hoffman related to the council's efforts to identify research opportunities in water conservation. Kevin Wagner mentioned the Texas Water Research Coordination Network. Robert Mace provided an overview of the state agencies' perspective with regard to the legislative report process. Karen Guz mentioned that the report should highlight water conservation plans, the importance of data collected from those plans, and the usefulness of those data to utilities, researchers, and beyond. No formal action was taken.
