Approval of Minutes from the October 15, 2013 Meeting

The Council took up and approved minutes from the prior meeting.

Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Presentation on TWDB Water Loss Audit Requirements and Data

John Sutton with the Texas Water Development Board presented on Water loss Audit requirements and data with the agency. The power point presentation can be found at: http://savetexaswater.org/meeting/agendas/index.htm

The presentation was followed by a question and answer session.

Question posed about accuracy of the information TWDB receives. Audits are checked by TWDB staff and return calls to the utility if data looks inconsistent. Additionally, the consolidated database which is being developed by TWDB will help utilities have access to past audits as well as comparison data. All

information will be readily accessible by the public.

There was discussion on the summary of the 2012 data and possible errors in the results. Several factors could go into the errors including not measuring the loss correctly, not accounting for specific water use, etc. TWDB staff works with the utilities to correct the reports and often removes data that seem unrealistic.

<u>Discussion and possible action on recommendations regarding Best Management Practices</u>

The Best Management Practices the Council has been developing were posted to the <u>Texas Water</u> <u>Development Board</u> and <u>Council</u> websites on Monday, November 18, 2013. Accompanying them was a press release and social media outreach.

The Council discussed Best Management Practice ideas for the coming months. The Industrial Workgroup (Karl Fennessey, CJ Treadway) is working on a refinery Best Management Practice and getting feedback from industry leaders. The Municipal Workgroup (Karen Guz) would like to update several of their Best Management Practices and will regroup to prioritize their next step. Commercial and Institutional Workgroup (Bill Hoffman) would like to update their Best Management Practice.

Discussion on upcoming Council activities and determine schedules

Question on if the Council will have input on conservation definition in Proposition 6 with TWDB. Discussion took place on the stakeholders' meetings currently with the 16 regional chairs. The Council is very interested in a representative from TWDB speaking at the January Council meeting to go through the timeline for all the rule making as well as be available to answer their questions in regard to the funding options.

The Council studied the new timeline for the 2014 Legislative Report. The timeline is similar to the previous timeline with extra time built in during the development stage. The Council approved the timeline as is with a possible meeting move from June to May.

The Council outlined the 2012 Charges and Contents document as it relates to the 2014 Legislative Report. Karen Guz suggested including information on some of the water efficiency network groups in the report as an evidence of more progress. Denise Hickey will work to get a fact sheet from the organization in the Dallas/North Texas area. Bill Hoffman suggested the Council include more data and statistical analysis in the report to be on par with similar reports that have been released.

The Council decided to all send input to TWDB support staff to compile all responses to update the document and bring back to the meeting in January to work on the final document. The Council will then make final decisions on what to include in the 2014 document.
